




University of Otago

Undergraduate Scholarships

Vice-Chancellor's Scholarships for International Students NZD\$10,000 for tuition fees. Unlimited offers.

University of Otago Global Scholarships for India, Indonesia, Malaysia, Singapore, South Korea, Thailand, Vietnam and China (Mainland China, Hong Kong, Macau). NZD\$15,000 for tuition fees. Unlimited offers.

University of Otago International Academic Excellence Scholarships

Up to NZD\$35,000. Applicable to high achieving international students. Competitive selection.

University of Otago International Partnership Scholarship

Up to NZD\$10,000 for tuition fees. Applicable to international students applying for articulation/transfer degree programmes via an Otago partner institute. Selection process.

University of Otago Entrance Scholarships (NZ Based)

Up to NZD\$45,000. Applicable to international students in New Zealand high schools or foundation programmes. Application period 1 July-15 August only. Competitive selection.

Postgraduate Scholarships

Vice-Chancellor's Postgraduate Scholarships for coursework Master's or PG Diplomas. Minimum GPA B+. Unlimited offers. NZD\$10,000 for tuition fees.

University of Otago International Master's Research Scholarship

NZD\$18,204 stipend per annum plus a partial tuition fee waiver (capped at the domestic fee rate) for international students enrolling in a research Master's programme.

University of Otago Doctoral Scholarships

For students enrolling in a Doctoral programme. Scholarship value: NZD \$32,544 stipend per annum plus a domestic tuition fees waiver for 36 months.

Manaaki New Zealand Scholarships

Full tertiary scholarships for eligible international students to study at a New Zealand university. otago.ac.nz/manaaki-scholarships

Check entry requirements

Evidence of academic and English language requirements must be included as part of your application: otago.ac.nz/international/future-students. If you do not meet our academic or English language requirements, you may wish to consider enrolling in one of our pathway programmes. otago.ac.nz/pathway

Don't meet entry requirements?

Otago offers Foundation Studies Certificates with three intakes per year (February, June, October). Otago offers 'English for Otago' language courses, supporting students to meet entry requirements for undergraduate and postgraduate study.

All applications must be submitted online

Apply directly online using the "Apply Now" button on the top of the programme page. This takes you to the University of Otago admissions application system, called eVision. Check you have the documents required for your application as outlined on the website. You can also choose to apply through an authorised Otago education consultant (agent) in your country: otago.ac.nz/international/agents

Submit your application

Once you have completed your application information and uploaded your documents, you need to click the SUBMIT button. You will need to check your eVision portal regularly for any notifications or additional information that may be requested.

Accept your offer of place

Successful applications will be issued with an offer of place letter through the eVision portal. To secure your place you will need to click the "Accept" button. Your offer of place letter has other important information covering student visa, insurance, tuition fees and next steps.

Undergraduate Programmes

Diplomas

For students who have just missed out on university entrance, the University of Otago Diplomas enable a transition from high school to a Bachelor's qualification. The Diploma is equivalent to the first year of undergraduate studies. Students who successfully complete the Diploma are able to progress to the second year of their relevant Bachelor's degree at the University of Otago. The Diplomas are currently offered in Arts, Commerce, and Science. They are taught over a period of two 13-week semesters plus an examination period, aligned to the regular University academic year.
