How did the academic experience/workload/style of teaching differ from Otago?

Uni applied for my residence permit for me so it was an easy process – I did have to pay 97CHF before I left then 140CHF when I got there so was an expensive process – these are all hidden costs that aren't really told before leaving either

Did your host university have a mandatory insurance?

Yes, so I had to buy two lots of insurance. In St Gallen I would recommend Swisscare insurance.

## Extra-curricular/Social Activities

What organised activities were available to students? What extra-curricular activities would you recommend to future exchange students?

Lots of organised actives (the Buddysystem was great for exchange student events – including fondue and parties, hiking and skiing weekends and lots of trips to local sites). Many other clubs and societies you can join too.

What was the university/city like?

Lovely small city (80,000 people) and university (10,000 people). It is a business school and one that is quite hard to get into so everyone is very motivated. The city is small but lovely and so beautiful.

Any recommendations for things to do, places to visit, places to eat etc.?

Eating out is expensive but there are so many other things to do. There are many hikes around and small cities, beautiful cathedral, chocolate and cheese factory, Shutzengarten beer and Appenzeller wine factory, free wildlife park and many skiing spots around in the winter.

It is an expensive place to go – there are lots of costs when I got there that I didn't plan for including extra insurance and my residence permit so go prepared to spend more than you think. I went to Konstanz to buy my food as meat was a lot cheaper and buying a half fare pass for public transport was very handy.
