Archaeology: It Matters! Was not a useful paper for a New Zealand student to take! It discusses the ethics and modern applications of archaeology from a very... British point of view. That is to say, while they might find a lot of the ideas of community and public inclusive archaeologies to be quite novel, it is what we are taught from day one at Otago!

How did the academic experience/ workload/ style of teaching differ from Otago?

It really is a very similar system with similar grading and workloads! I didn't feel much of a transition in terms of the work. I did find that the courses offered were a lot more varied but overall in course structure and teaching methods there is not a huge difference. I would say however, with papers in general, there are less contact hours then you would have at Otago, especially in the humanities.

Food is a lot cheaper in the United Kingdom, from the supermarkets - not out, so it hasn't been too bad for basic living needs. My largest spending has been on trips around Europe, if you get a chance to travel do it but do it wisely! There are lots of ways to save money when exploring and I'd urge research and planning when it comes to separate trips.

I used Wise, an internet/card banking system which converts money to different currencies as needed. It is very easy to use and organise and only takes a small percentage when converting.

I'd suggest to look out for the "Give It A Go" events, some of these include planned trips over the United Kingdom, you can go on a day trip to Cambridge or the Stonehenge or through the Cotswolds. These are definitely worth doing, especially if you can organise to go with friends. The students union also has a bar and nightclub which hold events and themed parties through the year. There are also lots of public lectures and opportunities to explore different subjects and topics in the University.

What was the university/ city like?

Cardiff is absolutely lovely and it reminds me of Dunedin in many ways. The weather is very up and down and never predictable, the people are friendly and easy going, and in South Wales you are super close to some beautiful landscapes, nature, and castles. It is a ever-changing city with lots going on. I would also credit it as being very convenient for those who do like to travel and explore, there are so many buses, trains, and flights, out to the rest of the country and the world, Cardiff is an excellent base which will allow you to do many things!

Any recommendations for things to do, places to visit, places to eat etc.?

If you can go and see a show or an Opera or anything in the Millennium centre, do it! It is a beautiful venue and it's set at Cardiff Bay which is a lovely area to explore. I'd suggest you try avoid Greggs, the British will really try and get you hooked but its honestly nothing to write home about. If you have to eat on Campus the Green Shoots Cafe inside the main building has always been my favourite!

Any tips for future students?

Look into concerts in the United Kingdom ASAP, if your favourite artist is coming anywhere into the country, buy tickets, you can figure out hotels and trains once you get here, but you really don't want to miss out! This place is about the size of New Zealand except with very comprehensive and accessible public transport, make the most of it while you can!
