

Sciences outreach certificate

Briefing Sheet

To achieve our Science Outreach Certificate, you need to have contributed a minimum of 60 hours to science outreach/community engagement activities or events.

- Keep a logbook/file of the outreach activities you do.
Your logbook/file should outline:
 - What you did?
 - What were the goals of the outreach activity?
 - How successful you think the activity was in achieving those goals.
 - Any lessons you might have learned from it,
 - Have your hours signed-off by staff member confirming what you contributed to each outreach event/activity in your logbook.

When you have completed 60 hours. write a reflective statement on:

- What you think you have gained from the whole experience.
- Any science communication upskilling you undertook to improve your community engagement/outreach skills.
 - (e.g. YouTube clips/TED Talks, workshop sessions, papers/books read on science communication techniques etc)
- Any specific training sessions/support you think would have been helpful to you.
- Email your logbook as a PDF to: steve.broni@otago.ac.nz
 - (Science Community Engagement & Learning Committee Chair),
 - (until such times as a new on-line process is set-up, approved and specified on the Uni website)

Your Logbook and reflective statement is then presented to the [SCEL \(Science Community Engagement & Learning Committee\)](#) for approval.

Once approved a pdf and hard copy of your certificate will be sent to you.
