Right next to a corner shop and only a couple stops on tram to the supermarket. 20 minutes on the tram to university and another 5 into the centre so is good location. There is a free to use basketball court and calisthenics gym outside with a football cage, volleyball court, and tennis court you can book as well as a grill you can also book. Table tennis and study rooms also in the dorm. Overall, pretty good experience in accommodation.
